
Sermon Series: Belong + Believe April 21st 2024



Look, here is water! Here is our water of life! Alleluia!



Look, here is water! Here is our water of life! Alleluia!



Look, here is water! Here is our water of life! Alleluia!




The Psalm will be sung. Cantors will sing the verses while the assembly sings the refrain.

Epistle Reading | Acts 4:5-12





I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. All share signs of peace with each other, saying "Peace" or "Peace be with you" or similar words.





as we forgive those who sin against us. Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen.


Communion

UPDATE FROM THE CARING FOR CREATION TEAM | SOLAR PANEL PROJECT

We are over the moon—or should we say, "over the sun", that we as a congregation have reached our goal of \$63,500 for the 44-panel solar project for our church and community! Thank you to all who supported the project with money or prayer. We have contacted the installer to set a date for the panels to become a permanent part of our roof sometime this summer. More to come on how we hope to encourage care for God's creation.

FREE ELECTRONICS RECYCLING EVENT

We will be having our electronics recycling event Saturday, May 18th, 2024 10am – 2pm. This recycling is for household electronics and our partners in this are Total Reclaim and Eagle River High School green club. The cost is FREE / carload, which is quite a deal considering how much it costs to recycle. Monitors or large screen TVs will have a small cost. Appliances (refrigerator, dryer, washer) and smoke detectors are not allowed because appliances take up too much room and smoke detectors contain radioactive materials. If you'd like to help, they will set up at 9:30 and we've divided sign up into two slots 9:30 to 12 and 12 to 2:30 and we'll post that after church Sunday. Volunteers usually just help direct traffic, answer questions, etc. No real manual labor because Total Reclaim brings a bunch of guys to disassemble the materials into their component parts. Let your neighbors and co-workers know. Let's keep these things out of the dump!

The Art of Spiritual Practice

This week we observe Earth Day on April 22nd. It is not a day just to pick up litter or vow to be a little better at recycling, although these are steps. What matters Is what motivates us to care for the Earth? Ultimately a recognition of the fact that our lovely blue and green planet floating in a vast universe is a unique creation, crafted by the love of God.

Teilhard de Chardin, paleontologist and priest writes in Letters to a Traveler, All that really matters is devotion to something bigger than ourselves. The more I devote myself in some way to the interests of earth in its highest form, the more I belong to God.

By loving the Earth with humility (I think of the hymn, *How Great Thou Art*) and with a tender love for how this physical earth reflects the very nature of Love in its highest form, the more we "belong to God." We are not separate from this planet. We are made of the very same elements. Yet we are conscious! How will we use this awareness to honor and protect this earth so all beings can survive and thrive?

The spiritual practice: Ask yourself ,"What is my relationship to Earth? Does it reflect an honoring of God, a belonging to God, an inspiring by God?"
