


# Holy Trinity Sunday

## Welcome!

There is a place for you here. *Just as you are*.

We extend welcome to those who are single, divorced, married, widowed, or if your relationship status is "complicated". We love families, no matter how you define them.



We are glad you are here whether you come every Sunday or if this is your first time at our church or any church at all. You are welcome here if you know the bible backwards and forwards, or have never really read it, if you know Jesus or are just curious to hear what he is all about.

We welcome you if you have doubts about "organized religion" or are a "cradle Christian". We welcome liberals, conservatives, moderates, and undecideds. If you cheer for the right team, or don't like sports, you are welcome here.

We especially welcome those who could use a prayer right now, or an assurance that God loves them, those who are struggling, and those who are doing okay.

We embrace children! We are used to the joyful sounds and wiggles of our youngest siblings in Christ and gladly welcome them in worship. We have a kids area with quiet toys and activities along with activity bags near the main entrance to the sanctuary to help keep restless hands busy. A family room is also available in the back and is equipped with a large window facing the sanctuary and a speaker to hear what is being said.

Today's Introduction:

When we say God is the triune God, we are saying something about who God is beyond, before, and after the universe: that there is community within God. Our experience of this is reflected in Paul's words today. When we pray to God as Jesus prayed to his Abba (an everyday, intimate parental address), the Spirit prays within us, creating between us and God the same relationship Jesus has with the one who sent him.

All may make the sign of the cross, the sign that is marked at baptism, as the presiding minister begins.


Blessed be the holy Trinity, + one God, the God of manna, the God of miracles, the God of mercy. Amen.

#### Psalm Reading | Psalm 29 The reading is read responsively.

<sup>1</sup>Ascribe to the LORD, O heavenly beings, ascribe to the LORD glory and strength. <sup>2</sup>Ascribe to the LORD the glory of his name; worship the LORD in holy splendor. <sup>3</sup>The voice of the LORD is over the waters: the God of glory thunders, the LORD, over mighty waters. <sup>4</sup>The voice of the LORD is powerful; the voice of the LORD is full of majesty. <sup>5</sup>The voice of the LORD breaks the cedars: the LORD breaks the cedars of Lebanon. <sup>6</sup>He makes Lebanon skip like a calf, and Sirion like a young wild ox. <sup>7</sup>The voice of the LORD flashes forth flames of fire. <sup>8</sup>The voice of the LORD shakes the wilderness: the LORD shakes the wilderness of Kadesh. <sup>9</sup>The voice of the LORD causes the oaks to whirl. and strips the forest bare; and in his temple all say, "Glory!" <sup>10</sup>The LORD sits enthroned over the flood; the LORD sits enthroned as king forever. <sup>11</sup>May the LORD give strength to his people! May the LORD bless his people with peace!

## Epistle Reading | Romans 8:12-17

In describing the new life of faith, Paul refers to all three persons of the Trinity: the Spirit leads us to recognize that we are children of God the Father and joint heirs with Christ the Son. <sup>12</sup>So then, brothers and sisters, we have an obligation, but it isn't an obligation to ourselves to live our lives on the basis of selfishness. <sup>13</sup>If you live on the basis of selfishness, you are going to die. But if by the Spirit you put to death the actions of the body, you will live. <sup>14</sup>All who are led by God's Spirit are God's sons and daughters. <sup>15</sup>You didn't receive a spirit of slavery to lead you back again into fear, but you received a Spirit that shows you are adopted as his children. With this Spirit, we cry, "Abba, Father." <sup>16</sup>The same Spirit agrees with our spirit, that we are God's children. <sup>17</sup>But if we are children, we are also heirs. We are God's heirs and fellow heirs with Christ, if we really suffer with him so that we can also be glorified with him.

## Gospel Reading | John 3:1-17

<sup>1</sup>Now there was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, a leader of the Jews. <sup>2</sup>He came to Jesus by night and said to him, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God; for no one can do these signs that you do apart from the presence of God." <sup>3</sup>Jesus answered him, "Very truly, I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God without being born from above." <sup>4</sup>Nicodemus said to him, "How can anyone be born after having grown old? Can one enter a second time into the mother's womb and be born?" <sup>5</sup>Jesus answered, "Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. <sup>6</sup>What is born of the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit. <sup>7</sup>Do not be astonished that I said to you, 'You must be born from above.' <sup>8</sup>The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit." <sup>9</sup>Nicodemus said to him, "How can these things be?" <sup>10</sup>Jesus answered him, "Are you a teacher of Israel, and yet you do not understand these things?

<sup>11</sup>"Very truly, I tell you, we speak of what we know and testify to what we have seen; yet you do not receive our testimony. <sup>12</sup>If I have told you about earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you about heavenly things? <sup>13</sup>No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. <sup>14</sup>And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, <sup>15</sup>that whoever believes in him may have eternal life.

<sup>16</sup>"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life.

<sup>17</sup>"Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him."




## Communion


The ushers will guide you forward. You may either stand or kneel at the communion rail. If you require a gluten-free option, keep your hands folded to receive a gluten-free wafer.

5 Wyatt J. 14 Mona M. 25 Nicole S. "Martha, Martha, you are worried and distracted by many things; there is need of only one." Luke 10:42"

This well-known story of Jesus visiting his friends, Mary and Martha, contrast Mary who was sitting at Jesus' feet, listening to her sister, Martha who was doing the responsible thing of hospitality—rushing around preparing food and worrying that everything was prepared. Jesus tells her there is need of only *one thing*. And he says, "Mary has chosen the better part."

The author and Franciscan priest, Fr. Richard Rohr, writes about this passage in his book, *The Naked Now:* "Martha was everything good and right, but one thing she was not. She was not *present*—most likely, not present to herself, her own feelings of resentment, perhaps her own martyr complex, her need to be needed. This is the kind of goodness that does no good! If she was not present to herself, she could not truly be present to her guests in any healing way, and spiritually speaking, she could not even be present to God. Presence is presence. How you do it is how you do everything."(p. 58)

The spiritual practice this week, and all weeks and all days and all moments is to be present to *how we do the moment*. Are you distracted? Worried? Planning ahead? Busy? Be present. So simple, yet so hard to practice. Yet it is what Jesus called only one thing that is needed.
